**CLUB FILM ON CANTERBURY FEATURES IN FESTIVAL**

In 1972 Canterbury Rotary paid for the restoration of one of the bays in Canterbury Cathedral, and a stone commemorating this support forms part of the restored bay. To raise the necessary funds the Club made and circulated to Rotary Clubs in Britain and America a 16 mm film depicting Canterbury and its Cathedral, as well as outlining the restoration project.

This 20 minute film is being shown at a Canterbury Festival event organised by the Department of Media (Tim Jones) of the Canterbury Christ Church University. Our film will be preceded by three documentaries featuring a great deal of archive film of the local area, under the general title "Archive and amateur film in East Kent".
