What Podgers discovers obliges Lord Arthur to contemplate the murder of at least three of his relatives, so that the wedding can go ahead. This delightful comedy contains an abundance of Oscar Wilde’s wit and genius, as well as a plot with many twists and turns brilliantly constructed by Constance Cox.
