



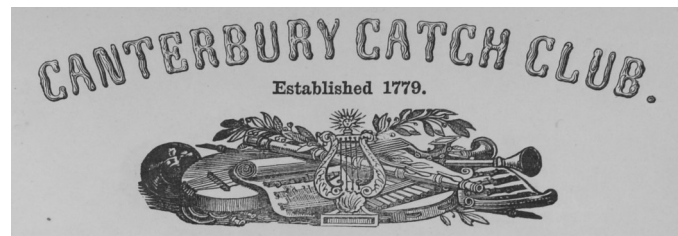

The Canterbury Catch Club existed between 1779 and 1865; throughout this period, an annual series of thirty concerts was held throughout the winter months.

Some of the music was provided by the members themselves, who would have been able to hold a part in the 'catches' which form the heart of the Club's repertoire. The more sophisticated glees would have been sung by more proficient members of the Club, including musicians in the service of the Cathedral at the time. And so it is today...

Today's Catch Club Ensemble - Cantuar - includes Chris Price and Jon Williams, of Good Gnu's fame; all the members are Lay Clerks in the present-day Cathedral Choir.
