MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 26 April 2016

- 1. PRESENT:** Peter Hermitage (President), Martin Ward (President Elect), Sharon Jordan (Vice President), Harry Cragg, Robert Boyd-Howell, Sharon Jordan, Bob Anderson, Viv Pritchard, John Harris, Margaret Griffin and Peter Hodge

- 3. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:** The Minutes of the Meeting held 29 March 2016 were approved.

4. MATTERS ARISING:

- (1) 4.1 Growth Opportunities meeting to be held on 28.04.16 – 18 attending so far.
- (2) 4.2 Big Sing profit £2,000. Hoping to include secondary schools next year. At present the Big Sing is scheduled to take place on 17.3.17 and should not be in competition with TCK 2017, which is planned for 8.4.17. The Big Sing could well be a ticket selling opportunity. MW reported that TCK needs somebody to come forward who is prepared to be the Project Manager.

- (3) Joint Pentangular Project – Margaret Griffin is giving a presentation of the Juba Project on 5.5.16 when DG Visits. The issue of risk was discussed at the International Committee, particularly insofar as monies may be at risk. The Diocese of Salisbury has been involved in dealing with the school we are endeavouring to help and attempts will be made to discuss with their team how they have managed in the past. Unfortunately one of the people we would like to see has experienced ill health and therefore the opportunity has been delayed. MG is due to visit Juba in the near future.
- (4) 4.4 Replies are being received from those who loaned money for the website development. Most are requesting that their money be donated for further website development.
- (5) 4.5 Measuring Success – Bob Anderson has spoken with Jarle Tatt to discuss how the success of a club can be measured. Very few clubs are signed up to "Rotary Club Central" (an online tool to help clubs set and track their goals and achievements). BA has a further meeting 5.5.16 to see how we can progress this issue.

DB reported that there had been discussion in the Committee on whether we could support the funding of a primary care nurse to work with "Catching Lives." This would be over more than one year and would cost £4k per year. It was agreed that such a venture requires longer term planning both within our club and possibly with the other Canterbury Clubs. The funding might come in part through the "Pentangular Gift" of €2,000 that comes with a home pentangular meeting. The idea was not rejected by Council.
