1. Minutes. The Minutes of the meeting held on 6 February were agreed.

**2.** Charitable Funds Available: £713 of which up to £150 may be needed for the St Nicholas School Kids Out Winter Event - this may now take place on 27 March.

3. Cheque Presentations. In view of the difficulty of finding "speakers slots" it was agreed that cheques could be sent to the recipient charities as follows: Rising Sun  $\pounds$ 500; Porchlight  $\pounds$ 1250; Hi Kent  $\pounds$ 500 – these amounts having been agreed at earlier meetings of the Committee.

7. DC updated the Committee on two matters requiring no further action: The Autistic Boy attending Dover College and a child needing a bed.

**8.** Tools for Self Reliance. RA reported on future new accommodation in the Hospice and took receipt of the cheque for the previously agreed donation of £250.

**9. Canterbury Care Leavers Christmas** The success of this event was acknowledged as worthy of our support in the future but not as the event organisers.

**10.** Skeleton Blog from Rachel Hannagan. Her further report was received and it was noted that she will be attending a club meeting in the near future.

**11. Prince of Wales Youth Club (PWYC).** The boxing equipment had been purchased and delivered to the club. The formal presentation will take place at the Youth Club on 19 April at 4.30 pm.

**12.** Barking Mad & The Martha Trust. The requests for a donation from these charities were not agreed.

13. Catching Lives (CL). DC drew the Committee's attention to the recent 5 day closure of CL's day centre, which was the result of vandalism by a few of the clients. The Committee noted that the  $\pounds$ 800 donation for the urgent repair of the windows had not yet been used for this purpose – DB and JH agreed to visit CL to find out why.
