# Meeting of the Club Council held on Monday, 14th April 2025 at Rosemary Doyle's

- 1. **Present:** President Maxine Blades, Andrew Clague, Raj Dasan, Rosemary Doyle, Neil Fraser, Tony Loughran, Robin Vickers and Graham Bough for item 3.
- 2. **Apologies** for absence had been received from Richard Kemball-Cook.
- 3. **2025/26 Budget Discussion**: After consideration of known increased costs for the year ahead, including RIBI and Rotary District, it was agreed to recommend to the Club a subscription of £215 plus voluntary Foundation contribution of £20 total £235 for the Rotary year 2025/2026 being an increase of just under 4%.
- 4. Minutes of the meeting of Club Council held on Monday 17th March 2025 were agreed.

## 5. Secretary's Business –

- a. RGB&I database showing 48 members & 1 honorary member as of 06/04/25.
  - i. New member Karen Joy will be inducted on 6<sup>th</sup> May.
  - ii. The basis of allocation of new members to Groups was discussed and it was agreed to follow the present basis of asking new members to attend each of the 3 spending groups for 2 meetings each and subsequently to agree with the President of the day which Group they would wish to serve on. New members would be included on the Club Stewarding rota as a further means of meeting members.
  - iii. The tribute to John Hill given by Robert Yonge at the April 1<sup>st</sup> meeting had been well received by Mrs Joan Hill and the Club.

#### 6. President's Business:

- a. The Point update: Andrew Clague reported that the Point is largely complete now with just a small amount of carving to be done. The response to the invitations for the unveiling was going well and all preparations for the unveiling on the 29<sup>th</sup> April were also well in hand.
- b. Cooperation with Local Clubs

  - ii. Inner Wheel 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday greetings & Church service/Afternoon Tea: President Maxine had attended the Inner Wheel Centenary lunch which had been excellent. The Inner Wheel Church service will be on the 22<sup>nd</sup> April at 2.00pm followed by afternoon tea in Littlebourne Village Hall.
  - iii. Whitstable Club VE Day event at The Crescent Turner Hotel on 7<sup>th</sup> May will be at a cost of £35 per capita to include a donation of £10 to their Club Charity account.

- d. Events and Fundraising update 2025/6

  - 2025/6 DG Penny Spiller is taking a relaxed approach in her approach especially in supporting collaboration between Clubs and areas when holding events and other activities.
  - iii. Revised NE Area: Faversham Club has been re-allocated to a different district but will continue to meet with our cluster group.
  - iv. Eastbourne Conference in October has been cut back to 2 days with no Gala Dinner.

#### 7. Dining Arrangements:

President Maxine and President Elect Raj had met with the management of Abbotts Barton Hotel in New Dover Road following it's refurbishment and are interested in offering Club meals. Sunrise Club are using this venue and find it satisfactory and Forest of Blean Club are considering moving there. Howfield Manor meals had proved variable and the location out of town is not good for some members. It is proposed to continue Business Meetings at The Kent and Canterbury Club subject to review in December and to move Club meetings to Abbotts Barton Hotel as from July with review in December at a cost to members of £25 for a 2 course meal and coffee, the same as at present at Howfield Manor.
