CRP advise RC Dhaka of needy patients and they undertake the work at discounted rates met by Rotary funding.

	Out of the total funds donated, £10,576.81 has been lent in 325 loans.		
	These small loans have been made to 1,272 entrepreneurs, 4,071		
	family members have been helped, 888 jobs created and overall, 6,231		
	people have been helped.		
	Funds totalling £628.90 currently remain available to lend.		
	RV will continue to monitor the funding requests posted on the LWC		
	website with a focus on food production and related equipment,		
	predominantly in the countries of Ecuador, Vietnam, Pakistan,		
	Rwanda, Zambia and the Philippines.	RV
