4	Progress on current initiatives + recent contacts		
4.1	Rotary Club of Dhaka, Bangladesh JR reported that the Cancer Prevention and Screening Project and the Prosthetics Project for underprivileged peoples continue and are successful. Projects which the ISG may wish to support in future are as follows: An ongoing Project is a 'Flood Project' to help rebuild homes of those affected by floods in border areas of Bangladesh. These are often very rudimentary homes and the affected families are often poor, tribal minority groups. JD has seen such homes and spoken with those affected and she has photos if anyone wishes to see them. A new Project is the 'SEE Project', an eye screening project at Government Schools in and around Dhaka, Bangladesh. Children who attend Government Schools are more likely to be from underprivileged backgrounds; JR agreed to continue to communicate with RC Dhaka as they are able to identify financial needs and to bring any appropriate projects to the ISG meetings for consideration. 	peoples continue and are successful.		
	RD advised that <b>a new project</b> , the 'Cataract Operations' Project, is		
	expected to be set up in the near future which the ISG may wish to		
	support.  RD agreed to continue to communicate with RC Kandy as they are able		
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	to identify financial needs and to bring any appropriate projects to the	RD	
	ISG meetings for consideration.		
4.3	Lend With Care (LWC)		
	RV advised that the microfinance organisation LWC continues to work		
	well and he did not consider it necessary to provide further funds for		
	the LWC organisation during the 2025/26 Presidential year.		
	He reported that, in all years to date, the RCC has donated £3,050.00		
	to LWC to facilitate micro-finance loans to beneficiaries.		
	A further 8 new loans have been made recently as to: Farming		
	projects in Zambia, Kenya, Vietnam, Rwanda, Togo, Philippines,		
	Ecuador and Malawi.		
	Out of the total funds donated, £10,936.81 has been lent in 333 loans.		
	These small loans have been made to 1,304 entrepreneurs, 4,165		
	family members have been helped, 900 jobs created and overall, 6,369		
	people have been helped.		
	Funds totalling £548.40 currently remain available to lend.		
	RV will continue to monitor the funding requests posted on the LWC		
	website with a focus on food production and related equipment.	RV
